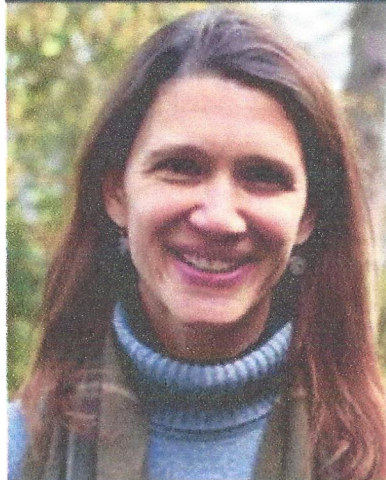

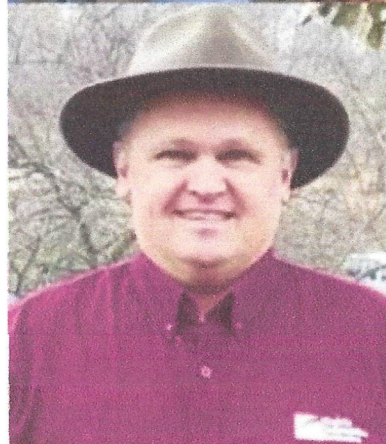

Shenandoah Valley Karst Geology Explained – Kurt McCoy, USGS Hydrologist – Surface water and Ground water mix frequently – springs provide the base flow of the streams and rivers, while relatively thin soils and sink holes allow surface water to enter the ground water. Result is Page Valley has significant quantities of good quality ground water that can be easily influenced by the way we use the land surface.
